RABBINIC REFLECTIONS



Expressing our Judaism Through Prayer & Action

Finding New Meaning and Inspiration in our Shabbat and Holiday Services.

Most of us who grew up in Reform Congregations remember using the Union Prayer Book, Volume I on Shabbat and Volume II for the High Holy Days. Then Gates of Prayer was published in 1975 and Gates of Repentance in 1978. In 2007, the Central Conference of American Rabbis published a new Siddur, Mishkan T'filah, a very different prayerbook for Shabbat, festivals and weekdays. Because this prayerbook was so different, our original plan was to begin using it just once a month. However, the reaction to Mishkan T'filah was overwhelmingly positive and so the Religious Practices Committee and the Board decided to go ahead and use it each week. With the addition of choice of modern alternative readings for the traditional prayers, most of us have found new beauty and meaning in our worship.

Now work has begun on a new Reform Machzor (High Holy Day Prayerbook). The plan is to publish this new Machzor before Rosh Hashanah in 2015 - two years from now. In the meantime, intensive piloting for this book began a year ago. Early drafts of some of the services were piloted by several congregations last year. This year there are pilot editions for most of the services, with Union for Reform Judaism congregations having the option of using these drafts during High Holy Day services this September.

This is a wonderful opportunity for members of our congregation to have a voice in deciding the content of the Reform High Holy Day Prayerbook which will be used for the next generation. Recognizing that we are all used to the prayers and format of Gates of Repentance, we are not going to make any changes to our evening or morning services. However, we will be using the pilot edition for the Yom Kippur afternoon service.

When I read through the PDF of the new afternoon service, I was very impressed and moved by many of the new readings. My biggest concern is which of the alternative readings to use (without making the service even longer). After Yom Kippur we will have the opportunity to send feedback to the editors. But even before that, I would like to invite your participation. If you would like to review the service and help choose which prayers and readings we will include, let me know by email (rabbi@cciaugusta.org) or by calling the Temple office and I will send you the PDF file. (Unfortunately, since the document is over 50 pages, we will not be able to send you a printed copy before Yom Kippur, but we will have a couple of copies in the Temple office if you would like to review it at the Temple).

We will have a meeting at the Temple on Thursday, August 22 at 7:00 PM to discuss your reactions and suggestions. If you will be unable to attend that meeting you can send me your ideas. I look forward to working with you as we share in creating this new High Holy Day Machzor.

Living our Jewish Values

Something wonderful and inspiring has been happening at Congregation Children this summer! Each Sunday morning 15 to 25 people have gathered at the Temple to make lunches for children in the Smart Lunch Smart Kid program. We are always concerned about how to get people involved in our Temple programs and how to find volunteers. However, this summer Congregation Children of Israel members, young and old, have joined us in this important effort. Some have only been able to come once or twice, but most people came week after week, making the peanut butter and jelly sandwiches, bagging the sandwiches along with drinks and snacks, to be delivered on Mondays to children in Augusta who, during the school year, receive free or subsidized lunches each school day.

We all knew that this was a clear expression of our Jewish teachings and values through our actions by feeding the hungry, but it also turned out to be a wonderful social event. Temple members from age 6 to 75, including many of our teenagers, looked forward to seeing each other each Sunday, even as they expressed their commitment to helping those who are less fortunate.

There are very few activities that would bring out people week after week throughout the summer, but this project caught our hearts and minds. At times when we have had discussions about what is most important for a congregation, social action activities have come out at the top. Prayer and holiday observances are, of course, important, as is Jewish learning, but it is so important that we turn our prayers, rituals and study into action. I am grateful to Action Ministries for developing this program and allowing us to participate and, as Rabbi, I am deeply moved to see the participation of our members.

Our thanks to all those who participated or contributed food or funds for this project. And a special thank you to Ila Abramovitz for coordinating this effort, encouraging donations of food and funds, buying the food, setting up each Sunday, and delivering the bag lunches on every Monday.




