RABBINIC REFLECTIONS

Life Long Jewish Learning

On Yom Kippur morning I spoke about the centrality of learning in Judaism. Study is sometimes referred to as being equal to all the other commandments combined. Jewish learning does not stop at Bat or Bar Mitzvah age, or when we graduate. It is truly something we are commanded to do throughout our entire lives. There is always more to learn and new interpretations for what we have already studied. We learn in order to teach, we learn in order to do, and learn just to learn - in Hebrew referred to as *Torah L'shma* - study for its own sake. Below and on page 6 are several learning opportunities we are offering this year at Congregation Children of Israel. I hope you will participate. I look forward to learning together with you.

Our congregation has decided to launch an innovative initiative for adults called **Chai Mitzvah.** This program was created in 2008 as a way to engage adults in a Jewish journey throughout their lives. Chai Mitzvah encourages adults to take

some time to reflect on where they are Jewishly and what they would like to achieve. This program is based on the idea that Being Jewish means you learn all your life. There's always something new to learn, do, explore, apply. Most of us were taught about Judaism as children, but as adults we need to explore and develop our own Jewish lives.

As a 13 year old becomes a Bat or Bar Mitzvah, as adults we can each become a **Chai Mitzvah**.

Chai Mitzvah has five basic components in a nine-month program:

- 1. **Group study**, meeting monthly, with a set, text-based curriculum (you can see samples of the topics on the website (www.chaimitzvah.org) under "Resources")
- 2. **Personal study** what have you always wanted to learn a little more about? Jewish life, history, major figures, literature, culture? Design your own independent study
- 3. **Adopt a ritual/spiritual practice** and incorporate it into your life for the duration of the program see what kind of impact it has on your life.
- 4. **Take part in a social action commitment** in the community (either individually, or as a group)
- 5. **Celebrate the achievement!** At the end of the 9-month program, October through May, our synagogue will honor your journey. Participants who finish the program will receive a certificate from Chai Mitzvah, and a tree planted in their name, courtesy of JNF's collaboration with Chai Mitzvah.

Wherever you are in your Jewish life, **Chai Mitzvah** will provide a path toward deciding how you want to live your adult Jewish life

PJ Havdalah will introduce our children to the brief, but beautiful, Service marking the ending of Shabbat.


There will be crafts, a story and refreshments. You don't have to wear pajamas to come but they are acceptable attire for the kids.

Hebrew Vocabulary

There are many Hebrew words which we use in our English conversation, like *Torah, Challah, and Menorah*. In each newsletter, we will list and explain several Hebrew words, words we all ought to know, such as *Emet* – truth, *Rachamim* – compassion, *Eretz Yisrael* - the Land of Israel, *Medinat Yisrael* - the State of Israel, *Am Yisrael* - the People of Israel, *Mishpacha* - family, and *Tifilah* - prayer. Learn a couple of these words a week and try to make them part of your spoken vocabulary.

Understanding the Siddur and Jewish Prayer

Training for those who would like to learn how to lead parts of the service when the rabbi is away, as well as others who would just like to learn about the meaning and order or our prayers. For more information, contact Rabbi Klensin. Wednesday evenings at 7:00 PM: October 30, November 6 and 13.

Saturday Torah and Talmud Study

Each Saturday morning we gather for a brief, informal Shabbat morning service at 9:30 AM, followed by an hour of Torah study at 10:00 AM. For many years our synagogue members have studied the weekly Torah portion on Saturday mornings. We take turns reading a few verses of Torah and then have an open discussion of what the passage means and teaches us. We look at various Torah commentaries, as well as sharing our own interpretations and thoughts. **On most Saturday mornings, beginning Saturday, October 19, rather than studying the weekly Torah portion, we will study texts from the Talmud.** We invite you to join us whenever you are available on a Saturday morning.

Discussions of the latest edition of Reform Judaism Magazine

All members of Congregation Children of Israel and other Reform congregations should be receiving Reform Judaism Magazine four times each year. Each issue contains many informative, inspiring, and challenging articles. Soon after the publication of each issue we will have a discussion of some of the articles. ShalomTV - Aleph -Bet






