

RABBINIC REFLECTIONS



I want to begin by thanking you, the members of Congregation Children of Israel, for your confidence in me and for supporting the agreement which the Temple Board and I worked out extending my tenure with the congregation for an additional year, through June, 2015. After a great deal of thought, Francine and I decided that the summer of 2015 would be a good time for me to retire after 41 years in the active congregational Rabbinate. In the meantime, I look forward to the next year and a half as your Rabbi.

I missed sharing Shabbat with the congregation on December 13 and 14, but I was not alone. Steven Nathan, Jean Brody, and Meryl Alalof were with me and about 5,000 other Reform Jews at the Biennial Conference of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ). During the five days

of the Biennial, we worshiped together, studied together, shared experiences about our congregations, and so much more. One of the workshops Steven and I attended focused on Rabbinic Transition. It was helpful to me in understanding how I can best move toward retirement and how I can help the congregation make this transition.

The Shabbat and weekday services were moving and inspirational. The music, with the 100 member choir, was wonderful. There were several pieces which I will be suggesting for our services.

The keynote address delivered by URJ President Rabbi Rick Jacobs was filled with modern messages from the book of Genesis, the last section of which we read on that Shabbat. He began by talking about the importance of real hospitality in our congregations, from our first contact with people, whether by phone or in person, to the ongoing welcoming and caring for all our members and all who enter our synagogue. He spoke about the importance of engaging the next generation, about how all human encounters can reveal wisdom and holiness, and about social justice not being a politically partisan concept, but a critical part of what God requires of all of us.

As Rabbi Jacobs spoke about the reimagining the Jewish future, I thought about our preferences in regard to rituals, practices, and beliefs, and I realized that the terminology we use can often be confusing. When we use terms like "Classical Reform," or "more Conservative," "more Orthodox," "very Reform," etc., other people, and at times, we ourselves, may not know what we really mean. We need to give specific examples of what we mean when we say we prefer one of these approaches. What kinds of specific things would we like to see done differently when we say we want our synagogue to be more Reform or more traditional. This confusion is compounded by the fact that mainstream Reform Judaism is very different than it was 100 years ago, 50 years ago, or even 25 years ago. So when we think about our preferences we should do our best to define for ourselves and for others the specifics of what we are looking for.
