RABBINIC REFLECTIONS



It was good to see many of you at the Martin Luther King, Jr. service which was sponsored by the Progressive Religious Coalition of Augusta. Again this year, we had broad participation from the faith community. I took part in the service, providing the welcome from the Progressive Religious Coalition and an invocation, along with representatives from the Catholic, Protestant, Hindu, Buddhist, Unitarian, Muslim, and Baha'i communities.

The music of the Davidson Chorale added so much to the service. Of course, central to the service were the messages of the Rev. Dr. King, messages which remain so important here in Augusta and throughout the country.

The overflowing crowd at Trinity on the Hill United Methodist Church was deeply moved by the Keynote Address which was delivered this year by Arun Gandhi, the grandson of Mohandas Gandhi.

As we were preparing the service, I was, at first, disturbed by one of the quotations from Gandhi, who was absolute in his commitment to nonviolence, which read, "I am prepared to die, but there is no cause for which I am prepared to kill."

While our Judaism abhors taking the life of another, it teaches that when there is no alternative, in order to save our own life, the lives of our family members, or of other innocent people, it is permissible to kill the aggressor. Judaism teaches that we are to fight just, defensive wars. The people of the United States, and the people of Israel, know well that there are times when we must take up arms.

However, as I thought about that quotation from Gandhi, and King's teachings of nonviolence, I realized that while I cannot agree with their extreme positions, the opposite position is far more widely accepted and practiced in our society and world. And it is not just the extreme ways in which "stand your ground" laws are interpreted by some, but the general readiness to fight back. We do far too little talking and trying to understand the positions of those with whom we disagree. We are too busy trying to show we are right and that the others are wrong. This is the case in our own community, in Washington, and among the countries of the world. On the continuum between total pacifism and the immediate readiness to attack others, verbally or physically, we are far too close to the latter extreme. In the Psalms we are taught to "seek peace and pursue it." We greet each other with word "shalom—peace." In each of our services, we pray for peace. We need to pay more attention to Gandhi's messages of nonviolence than to the violent words and actions we see and hear of every day in the news. We all need to make more of an effort to hear the ideas of others and to be quicker to respond with understanding and compassion.

He has served as a member of the CCI Board, and as our President. Myra was also active volunteering at CCI through her membership in CCI Sisterhood and other activities. In my recent CCI Presidency Buddy volunteered to be on our committee that revised the Constitution. Buddy and Myra have always been great supporters of all CCI activities in my 20 years here and their enthusiasm and love of community has always been wonderful. They have always been friendly and welcoming exemplifying Jewish hospitality and Southern charm.
