RABBINIC REFLECTIONS



As I think we are all aware, our relationships within the broader community are vitally im portant. Each fall and spring all first year students at GRU Summerville Campus in the required introduction to humanities classes visit Congregation Children of Israel, as well as the Hindu temple and the Islamic Center. I cherish that opportunity to give these students a better understanding of Jews and Judaism. Many church groups come to visit, some for a Friday evening service, others to meet with me at a different time. I currently serve as president of the Progressive Religious Coalition of Augusta and am on the steering committee of the Interfaith Fellowship of Augusta, I participate annually on panels at Paine College and at the Medical School and am a member of a group working to prevent

teen pregnancy in our community. I spend time with these interfaith activities, not just because of my own commitment to bettering interfaith relations, but because these relationships are very important to us as a Jewish community.

I had intended to include the following letter from the Islamic Society of Augusta in my May newsletter article, but as it turned out we did not send out a newsletter in May. Although it has been a while since the letter was written, I believe the contents of this letter are still worth sharing as an expression of unity and support that says far more than one specific act of violence against our community.

"Dear Rabbi Klensin.

The crimes committed on April 13, 2014 at the Jewish Community Center of Greater Kansas City and Village Shalom in Overland, Kansas sadden us, and we are writing to express to you and your community's members our sympathy and solidarity.

"If there is any event in which we can participate to demonstrate these feelings, please inform us. If there is anything that we can do, please let us know.

"The Islamic Society of Augusta reaffirms its commitment to preserving the freedoms which make our lives as members of minority religious communities possible. It also recognizes its responsibility to advocate against the false rhetoric which blames widespread social problems on one religious or ethnic group or class and claims that violence against this group is appropriate.

As we have responded with concern and support when other groups have been attacked, it is gratifying to receive this letter from the Islamic community. Taking it a step further, the leadership of the Islamic Society has requested a time when some of the members of their community can attend one of our Shabbat Services, so they can learn more about us and Judaism.

I want to offer my congratulations to Rachel Ray and all the other officers and new trustees of Congregation Children of Israel, our Brotherhood, Sisterhood and Youth Group. I look forward to working with all of them during the coming year.

I hope that all of you who are reading this newsletter will join us on Friday evening, June 13, when our Temple leadership will be formally installed. Your support for them by attending the installation, and throughout the year, is vital for the well being of our congregation.

As some of you know, I was hospitalized briefly in late April and spent some time recovering. Francine and I very much appreciate the support and understanding of the temple leadership, and of so many of you who were aware of my health difficulties. I thank you for the meals, calls, emails, cards and prayers. I am doing much better now and returning to my normal activities.

LEARN TO LEAD SERVICES OR JUST TO BETTER UNDERSTAND HEBREW PRAYER

At times when we come to a service on Friday evening, it may seen like we are just reciting one nice prayer after another, in no particular order. In fact, the order of the prayers included in our Shabbat, Holiday, and weekday services was set down in the Mishneh, some 1800 years ago. The prayerbook is called a "Siddur" in Hebrew - related to the word "Seder" on Passover, when we relate, in order, the events of the Exodus.

As was announced some months ago, Rabbi Klensin will be working half time during the coming year, leading Shabbat Services approximately twice each month. The other services will be led by members of the congregation. If you would like to lead a service yourself, or together with another member, here is your opportunity to learn how to do so. This three session class will be offered in August on Tuesday evenings, beginning on August 5. While you will need to know some Hebrew, most Friday evenings, many of the Hebrew prayers will be lead by the soloist. Contact Rabbi Klensin if you would like to participate in these classes.

Even if you have no interest in leading services, learning about the meaning and messages of ancient and modern prayers can make your attendance and participation in the services more meaningful, bringing you closer to our Jewish past




