President's Message Augusta 2012 Robin Brigmon



We had a successful Rosh Hashanah at Congregation Children of Israel (CCI) last week. Thanks to Rabbi Klensin for organizing great services, Mark Dickens and our outstanding choir for the beautiful music, and of course our talented Cantorial Soloist, Joanne Greene, who blessed us with her beautiful voice. We appreciate all the volunteers who helped including the Brotherhood and Sisterhood. As I said during my speech, this is our 166th year of having

services at CCI in Augusta. I read some excerpts from Jack Steinberg's book on the rich history of CCI that evening. For example, CCI has been donating money to our brothers and sisters in Israel (or Palestine as it was referred to previously) since 1852. CCI has demonstrated much resiliency over the years while the membership went through wars, floods, earthquakes, recessions and the depression. CCI has always had a strong commitment to the community, service, and social action with strong leadership who have strived for excellence and believed in working for the future. We have much to be proud of but of course the future is now.

We are currently preparing for Yom Kippur, the holiest day of the year (Sept. 25-26), please consider this crucially important request: I did send out a High Holy Day Appeal to assist CCI in these tight financial times. We currently wish to replace our two aging sound systems at the Temple. Those of you who attend services regularly know of some of the problems we have had with the sound system in the sanctuary, with our first estimate @ \$4,000. In addition the sound system in the lounge is also in need of replacement. We also need to have an independent assessment of our CCI finances, which can cost up to \$6,000 for the multiple accounts. Any contributions would be much appreciated.

We now have an active Youth Group, thanks to the efforts of Rabbi Klensin, dedicated parents, and a great group of teenagers. We also have a new youth group director, Ms. Victoria Resnick. Ms. Resnick is a military veteran (language specialist), who is now attending Augusta State University. They all ready have several trips and activities planned.

Our CCI Clean-up day worked out wonderfully last month, with a Temple full of volunteers! Thanks to all who came out and raked, power washed, sorted, polished, repaired, cleaned (inside & out), trimmed, and schlepped with love. We appreciated Brotherhood that provided the bagels and snacks. It was hard work but a lot of fun and CCI looked great for the Holy Days! We will have another Clean up Day on November 18 for those who missed the last one.

Editorial by Marc Gottlieb



The year I was Confirmed, a few years after my Bar Mitzvah, I took a vow not to buy, wherever possible, anything German and not to visit Deutschland....ever. When I started getting involved in Holocaust Remembrance activities I added that I would not utter Hitler's name in any Temple or facility that was hosting a program I was

involved with. To this day, fifty two years later, I can say that I have kept those vows.

It was not always easy. My father drove a Mercedes Benz and my sister along with her husband owned a Volkswagen repair service.

After all these years I have new reasons to continue to adhere to these decisions. Once again a German district court has shown just how crass and bigoted they can be. They issued a court ruling that equated circumcision with doing illegal bodily harm to newborn males. In one act they not only offended the miniscule German Jewish population but also succeeded in insulting the Arab Islamic community for they too observe the practice of circumcision as a symbol of the relationship between Man and God.

Some, in Germany, may not have any contact with Jews or Muslims and therefore feel alienated from them. There seems to be, however, a real covert need among a sizable part of the German population to attack the practices of minority religions. The Wall Street Journal reflected that Chancellor Angela Merkel has urged quick action in overturning the local legislation saying Germany would be the world's "laughing stock" if it were to stifle Jews from practicing their religion. I personally don't care if they are laughing stocks, but more importantly religious practices of minority religions should not be controlled in any way by the state.

I would, in fact, let this situation go except for the actuality that over the last few years there have been similar legal attempts, mainly in California, to create similar legislation. The legislation there, also in the guise of worries about the health and welfare of the newborn male are blatant attempts to pass anti-Semitic rulings. The main progenitor of the California legislation is a known Holocaust denier and writer of anti-Semitic tracts.

We in America cannot afford to let any religion, no less minority ones, including Islam, be the brunt of legislation. We must be tolerant of others' religion and we must finally, once and for all, be educated to other's practices and not let bigots and extremists have their legislative ways.
